### RESEARCH OBJECTIVE

Research was conducted on behalf of Healthgrades in partnership with Suzy.

The goal was understand women's interactions with healthcare over the last 12 months to determine whether women have been keeping up with preventative care and health screenings recommended for their age and sex and if applicable, identify reasons women are delaying care



### **METHODOLOGY**

#### **US Consumer Survey**

Survey conducted on Suzy among a sample of US consumers and weighted to be nationally representative based on age, gender, ethnicity, and region. US consumers were asked about their role in their household's healthcare management, their recent healthcare visits, their attitudes and perceptions regarding preventative healthcare, their trust in health institutions, and their outlook on telehealth services.

Total survey completes: 1217





### Respondents reflect a nationally representative audience based on gender and age







### Respondents reflect a nationally representative audience based on ethnicity & region







### 3 in 5 respondents are employed in some capacity, HHI is evenly distributed




Respondent Median HHI = \$67,500 National Median HHI = \$67,521





### 3 in 4 respondents have a post-secondary level of education, 3 in 5 are married or in a domestic partnership





#### Nearly half of respondents have children living at home, average HH size is 3








#### 3 in 4 US adults have had some form of health care visit in the last 12 months

#### INTERACTIONS WITH HEALTHCARE IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS






# Significantly more women have had an interaction with healthcare in the past year compared to men

• Whether on their own or their family's behalf, 4 in 5 women have had interactions with healthcare in the past 12 months compared to 2 in 3 men

### Both women and men are neglecting gender-specific health screenings

# Most US women did not get the preventative health screenings recommended for their sex and age in the last 12 months

- Among women over the age of 21:
  - Only slightly over 1 in 3 got a gynecological exam
  - 1 in 3 got a breast exam
  - 1 in 4 got a pap smear
- Among women over the age of 40:
  - Only half have gotten a mammogram
  - Only 1 in 10 have gotten a colonoscopy
- Among women over the age of 50:
  - Slightly over half have gotten a mammogram
  - Less than 1 in 5 have gotten a colonoscopy
- Among women over the age of 60:
  - Less than 1 in 3 have gotten a bone density test
  - Only 1 in 5 have gotten a skin screening

### Overall, nearly half of Americans say they delayed, avoided, or skipped some form of health care visit in the last year

## Out of pocket cost is significantly more of an obstacle to women compared to men in terms of keeping up with health screenings



### Americans are most aware of recommendations around annual physical, vision, and dental exams

• Awareness of health screening recommendations increases among older Americans who have a high awareness for age specific screenings such as a cholesterol check or colonoscopy

## Overall, women are highly aware of health screenings recommended for their age & gender, suggesting that awareness is not their main obstacle to preventative care

- Only half of women 21+ are aware of health recommendations around pap smears
- Awareness of health screenings seems to increase among older women; this may be due to more interactions with healthcare as women age
